7. Progress updates from last meeting

Chair

a) St Andrew's Extraordinary PCC Meeting - 11/03/21

Blagdon Magazine - Opinions differed wildly about what to do about the Magazine. No conclusions were reached

Finances - Blagdon PCC are watching carefully to see the reaction to the Ubley stewardship letter and considering if they should do likewise. Should they be focusing more on community ownership and how will we use our building in the future?

b) St Bartholomew's (two interim meetings)

A letter is to go out to all regular givers in the parish to make them aware of the financial situation. A second letter is to go out to every household in the village on a similar theme. The PCC feel that they must consider greater community use of the building.

b) Money matters

- 1. One Church One Family Project:
- a. Pathway 1: 7 Marks of Healthy Church

HF

We have been looking at a timeline to see how our paths might begin to dovetail both as three parishes into one and also with reference to the journey taken by EWHB parish. A newsletter is planned to help disseminate information to the PCCs and Parishes and a gathering is planned for the end of June/July to help us learn about the 7 marks of a healthy church. We will be undertaking the church profile exercise. MS will also be supporting through the role of 'Build Back Better'. JL said that she was looking forward to receiving the newsletter and to thinking about what each of

JL said that she was looking forward to receiving the newsletter and to thinking about what each of the 7 Marks mean for us. We need to probe, engage and start discussions with our parishes - going beyond the headlines

HF said that she is looking forward to being able to work face to face

She would like to have a team to support and engage with the Healthy Church project The newsletter is to go out to the wider community with shortened versions included in the Parish Magazines.

b. Pathway 2: One Church One Family Project

Our statement of intent to become one parish was passed by the DMPG on 8th March 2021. Peter Evans, the Diocesan Secretary is also guiding us. The Archdeaconry Mission and Pastoral Group will meet to discuss our proposal in May. This is a legal process and must be in place before the Church Management Project can proceed.

c. What will be the name of the new parish?

Laura is to send out a document from Nigel. He asked us to consider who and what do we represent to the wider community. Are we faith based? Are we geographically based?

We must decide on a new name for our One Parish at the next PCC meeting

NC urged us to look at other examples of parishes and benefices and asked that everyone submit an idea by the end of Easter Week.

d. Pathway to 'Combining' with Harptree & Hinton Blewitt Benefice (EWHB) SL

This is an agreed aim in general principle, but with no fixed timeline or agreement about how or when this might be done. It is a new idea with much to be discussed. EWHB are to engage in their own Healthy Church Project to help us find similarities and to see if we are heading in the same direction. It is important to listen and not to rush.

e. Building Back Better

MS

What do you want your Church to do in our communities?

Maragret told us that this idea encompassed bith buildings and fundraising. It includes our churches' engagement with the vulnerable (perhaps through foodbanks), co-ordinating with local groups and the church working in the community. We need to have an outward-looking focus and be able to respond to need. Is there an appetite for change?

This ties in very well with Mark 2 of the 7 Marks of a Healthy Church.

PC noted that the strength of the community spirit the appeared during lockdown should be harnessed. We are looking for a practical expression of a healthy church - whether this relate to our schools, foodbanks or even climate action.

Helen asked for a volunteer from each parish to work with her on Mark 2.
